

# Parts of Speech



## Noun

A noun names a person, place, things or idea.

**Examples;** dog, cat, horse, student, teacher, apple, Mary and etc...

## Sentences

- They live in Madrid.
- This is my cat.

# Parts of Speech



## Verb

A **verb** is a word or group of words that describes an action, experience.

**Examples**; realize, walk, see, look, sing, sit, listen and etc...

## Sentences

- I like orange.
- Come in please.

# Parts of Speech



# Adverb

An adverb tells how often, how, when, where. It can describe a verb, an adjective or an adverb.

**Examples;** loudly, always, never, late, soon etc...

## Sentences

- My cat eats quickly.
- She spoke softly.

# Adjective



An adjective describes a noun or pronoun.

**Examples;** red, tall, fat, long, short, blue, beautiful, sour, bitter and etc...

## Sentences

- We like big cake.
- I have three pencils.

# Preposition



A preposition is used before a noun, pronoun, or gerund to show place, time, direction in a sentence.

**Examples;** at, in, on, about, to, for, from, out, of, after and etc...

## Sentences

- She was hiding under the table.
- There is some milk in the fridge.

## Parts of Speech

# Conjunction



Conjunctions join words or groups of words in a sentence.

**Examples**; and, because, therefore, moreover, since, or, so, until, but and etc...

## Sentences

- I am very hungry, but the fridge is empty.
- I was watching TV when she came in.

# Pronoun

Pronouns replace the name of a person, place, thing or idea in a sentence.

**Examples;** he, she, it, we, they, him, her, this, that and etc...

## Sentences

- He is very clever.
- 12th September is the date that I was born.

# Interjection



Interjections express strong emotion and is often followed by an exclamation point.

**Examples;** Bravo! Well! Aha! Hooray!  
Yeah! Oops! Phew! and etc...

## Sentences

- Wow! What a beautiful car!
- Oh no! I can't believe that it is snowing here again!
