to have a friendly relationship

- It's impossible to get along with her.

## Get out

to become known

- I don't want it to get out that I'm leaving.

## Get across

to make sb understand

- Your meaning didn't really get across.

## Get away

to escape from sb/sth

- She'll get away from work as soon as she can.

## Get (sb) down

to make sb feel sad

- When my work gets me down, I want to resign.

## Get through

to be connected by phone

- I tried to call her but couldn't get through.

## Get around

to visit lots of places

- It's quite easy to get around London.

## Get over

to overcome

- How would you get over that problem?
