

# Phrasal Verbs - **RUN**

## Run along

to tell sb to go away

- Run along now, children! I'm busy.

## Run after

to chase

- Why do dogs run after cats?

## Run across

to meet or to find unexpectedly

- I ran across some old friends at the party.

## Run away

to leave a place or sb

- The prisoners ran away from the prison.

## Run into

to experience sth unexpectedly

- I've run into a difficulty with the project.

## Run against

to oppose towards sb or sth

- Luck was really running against you yesterday!

## Run around

to be very busy doing lots of things

- The child ran around all day in the garden
