

# Using **In spite of** & **Despite**

**In spite of** and **despite** express a contrast between two things. They are prepositional expressions.

Followed by a noun phrase or pronoun or a verb in the 'ing' form.

## Example Sentences

- I love him **despite** his faults.
- The young men said that they would do it **despite** all of the difficulties.
- They went out **in spite of** the rain.
- **Despite** being a millionaire, she lives in a very small flat.
- The house will certainly sell **in spite of** the fact that it's overpriced.
- **In spite of** the fact that Mark helps the poor, he isn't rich.
- **Despite** her exhaustion, she tries to help us.
- **In spite of** the fog, planes are still landing.
- **Despite** her young age, she did a very good job.
- They helped them **in spite of** the difficulties.
- **Despite** the cool day, he doesn't want to go out.
